

For more than a century, Five Points South has been a multicultural haven for Birmingham's free-spirited creatives. Founded in the 1890s as the suburb town Highland, the neighborhood enjoyed streetcar access to downtown. Originally populated with stately Queen Anne houses, the architecture evolved to include many of the Art Deco, Spanish, and Craftsman style homes found there today. One certain architecturally interesting structure, the Studio Arts Building, is featured in the current Linn-Henley Gallery exhibit, *Five Points South: Patience, People, and the Plan.*

The Studio Arts Building is the somewhat crescent shaped building at the corner of 20th Street and 11th Street South, adjacent to Five Points Circle. Built in 1910, this multifunctional building became a vital part of making Five Points into an early arts district. The central location of the building began attracting a Bohemian crowd of people into the neighborhood. Over the years, the upper level of this building became a dance studio and a place for artists, such as well-known water color artist Max Heldman, to thrive. It was the epicenter of a neighborhood in Birmingham that valued creativity and art. The building also housed a grocery store, tobacco shop, and various bars over the years. In 1986, fire damage forced the building to be torn down. And it was not until 1993 that it was rebuilt and transitioned completely into a commercial building. A once thriving artistic hub became the home to a "Johnny Rockets" restaurant, a Birmingham Police Department Substation, and a night club called "Studio." A current list of tenants includes the popular Charlemagne Records. Through all of its changes over the decades, the Studio Arts Building still holds its popularity among the neighborhood residents and merchants and will always be a great example of Five Points', and Birmingham's, rich architectural past.

Haven't had the chance to experience *Five Points South: Patience, People, and the Plan* yet? Don't worry – it will be on display in the Linn-Henley Gallery through May 2017.
Additionally, Vulcan Park and Museum will host a Taste of Five Points experience on May 2, 2017 to coordinate with the exhibit and the 130th Anniversary of the start of the Five Points neighborhood. Keep up with visitvulcan.com for details!





A GIANT IMPACT Pam King

Many Alabamians are knowledgeable about the history and culture of Birmingham and the state, but few are quite as wellversed as **Pamela Sterne King**.

A history graduate of both Samford University and the University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB), Pam has spent the last 30 years as a historic preservationist and stateconsultant. Her wide expertise in Birmingham's history earned her the distinct honor of becoming the City of Birmingham's first Historic Preservation Officer.

For the past ten years, Pam has served as a fulltime and adjunct history professor at UAB.

As a proven historian, Pam has had the opportunity to put her knowledge on paper. Her 2008 publication, "50 Years and Counting – A History of Operation New *Birmingham*," highlights Birmingham's revitalization efforts from 1957 through 2007. King's other works Birmingham's document vital role in the Civil Rights Movement, the

history of company towns in Alabama, and include many National Register nominations recording the history of neighborhoods around the state.

Recently, Pam has shared her time and knowledge as an integral leader on the Vulcan Park and Museum scholars panel that guided the content creation for the current Linn-Henley Gallery exhibit – *Five Points South: Patience, People, and the Plan.* Her historical research is the foundation from which this exhibit was built. Simultaneously, Pam has become a tremendous asset for recruiting topnotch history interns to Vulcan Park and Museum who aid and support the creation of new and exciting educational programs.

In addition to her support of the educational programs at Vulcan Park and Museum, Pam King has truly become a "friend of Vulcan." And, for us, that impact is giant!
