A LOOK INTO LINN-HENLEY

New Exhibit Opening

From its inception nearly 150 years ago, Birmingham has stood as the center of the iron and steel industry in a region primarily known for its agrarian strength.

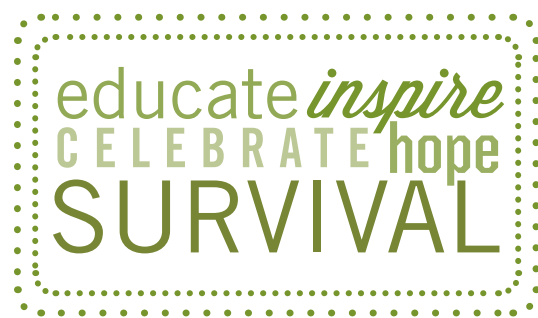
With an industrial foothold in the deep south came an opportunity for a demographic not reflected so predominantly in other southern cities. Birmingham's new industry created a diverse immigrant population to form new communities throughout the area.

They were very much reflective of the mining and manufacturing communities in their home countries. One of the most important groups was the Jewish immigrants who played a vital role in keeping Birmingham financially, educationally and industrially relevant. The continued pride in their heritage is now reflected in a moving tribute not only to Birmingham, but to the world itself.

"The memory of that night is never far from my thoughts. I recall the feeling of hunger, having no one to turn to for comfort, and the uncertainty of where I would go. I was a frightened ten-year-old boy, a little boy alone in the dark." -Aisic Hirsch

These and other stories of loss, family, hope and deliverance are told in the Birmingham Holocaust Education Center's (BHEC) exhibit *Darkness into Life: Alabama's Holocaust Survivors Through Photography and Art*. The exhibit, originally created in 2008, combines paintings of survivors' memories by Mitzi Levin with photography of the survivors in present day by Becky Seitel.

The original exhibit, on display at Vulcan® Park and Museum this fall, began with nine local holocaust survivors, but has since expanded to twenty. The survivors originated from several different European countries including Germany, Poland, Romania, and Belgium. All tell their unique stories in the exhibit



of life before World War II, during the Holocaust, liberation and life thereafter.

If you've ever experienced the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum in Washington D.C., then you know how hard it is to learn about the fate of an estimated six million European Jews and the others who survived. While detailing the struggles of the survivors, *Darkness into Life* also captures an unexpected emotional impact from the Holocaust. Instead of focusing on anger or revenge on those responsible, these survivors found a deep appreciation for life and family, as well as responsibility to share their stories in an effort to prevent such a horrifying event from ever happening again.

The BHEC was created to share these stories through the exhibit as well as other educational programs, including survivor talks. These talks, coordinated by the BHEC, are a chance for the survivors to share their stories so that the following generations will never forget their responsibility to stand against persecution and genocide. Vulcan® Park and Museum is pleased to host *Darkness into Life* in its Linn-Henley Gallery this September 25, 2015 through May 15, 2016.

Vulcans on Parade

Vulcan® Park and Museum unveiled the newest installation of our beloved ironman on August 26. This time, NOT atop Red Mountain. "Vulcans on Parade," a concept of the young professional community of Birmingham, was launched as a community-wide civic art project to bring more awareness to our history and cultural attractions.

"Vulcans on Parade" was the brainchild of a team of young professionals participating in the 2015 Project Corporate Leadership class. This program brings together young, local leaders who learn how to become more involved in the community and to focus on becoming leaders of tomorrow.

The team's idea was simple: choose a symbol that represents and unifies all of Birmingham, build miniature replicas of that image, have them painted by local artists, and place them at sites to showcase Birmingham's history and local attractions. This innovative outdoor art exhibit is a great way for our city to attract tourism

dollars while bringing more awareness to our cultural institutions.

Two painted replicas of Vulcan are now placed in downtown Birmingham; one temporarily at Railroad Park and the other at the Birmingham-Jefferson Convention Complex. The statues are eight feet tall and weigh around 100 pounds. Local artists **Paul Cordes Wilm** and **Carrie McGrann** completed the artwork celebrating the Birmingham metro area.

This pilot project was structured to kick off a series of "mini-vulcans" around the metro area. The goal is to have 20 statues in place throughout the area over the next year. 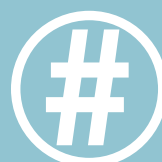

The Vulcans Community Awards is the premier event in our region dedicated to honoring people who – like Vulcan – stand for Birmingham! It is co-chaired by Mayor William A. Bell, Sr. and Shelby County Commissioner, Lindsey Allison.

The Vulcans Awards are intended to showcase the impact that dedicated individuals have on our community and recognize the importance of citizens throughout our seven-county region. The statue atop Red Mountain inspires hope in people who personify the values attributed to the Roman mythical figure, Vulcan. In the legend, Vulcan was ostracized by his community because of his physical imperfections, yet he responded by displaying humility, integrity, loyalty, compassion and unselfishness. Therefore, Vulcan® Park and Museum invites the community to nominate citizens who embody those qualities in their efforts to serve the Birmingham community. The *Vulcan* and *Spear* recipients are selected from those nominations.

This will be the second year Vulcan® Park and Museum has presented awards to recognize Birmingham residents in the categories of *Newcomer*, *Hero*, *Servant Leadership*, *Game Changer* and *Lifetime Achievement*. *Vulcan* and *Spear* awards for community commitment will be awarded to 13 outstanding citizens who display initiative or heroism that have or will have a significant impact on the quality of life in the region. Only one award will be given for *Lifetime Achievement*. In addition to an elegant atmosphere, you can expect to be inspired by the honorees' efforts. Brief, powerful presentations expressing the substance of their efforts will be showcased. Eight *Spear* honorees will also be presented with awards and applauded for their impressive civic contributions to the Birmingham region. All award recipients will be recognized at *The Vulcans Community Awards* dinner on Thursday, October 8, 2015 at The Club in Birmingham, Alabama.

Introducing Mark Akerman, Director of Education



Originally from Madison, Florida, Mark Akerman brings extensive experience as a historian, educator, administrator and museum professional.

The son of a leading historian in Florida, Mark developed a passion for history at a young age when his father was teaching and writing books about

early Florida. Mark attended the University of Florida where he studied under some of the prominent historians of the time and developed a love of Civil War and Southern Political History. He received two bachelor degrees in Applied History and Teaching History from Appalachian State University and later received a Master of Education in Administration and Supervision, from Florida A&M University. Other certifications and distinctions include completion of the Administrative Leadership Program at the Center for Creative Leadership in Greensboro, North Carolina. Mark received the 2005 Carlton Tebeau Book Award for the best book on Florida history, Jacob Summerlin, by the Florida Historical Society.

Mark's professional career began in museums, at the Center for Appalachian Studies in Boone, North Carolina. Amongst his many duties, he assisted in accessioning the Senatorial papers of the Hon. James T. Broyhill. It was at this time that he began writing for a Civil War magazine and became an avid Civil War living historian. He later established a reputation as an effective and well-respected school administrator, serving as principal at parochial schools in Florida, North Carolina and, most recently, Birmingham. A passionate educator

and leader, he is adept at developing programs that speak to the learning styles of today's youth, building consensus among individuals with diverse opinions, and incorporating sound financial practices. He has always felt that his role as an educator was to assist in developing good citizens through leadership opportunities.

Mark enjoys spending time with his family and he has a passion for genealogy, writing, and the Florida Gators.

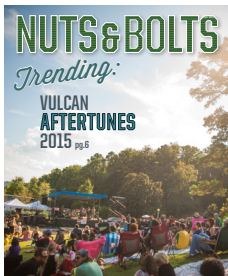

A GIANT IMPACT

Vulcan may be our area's iron giant, but the museum shop, where visitors find Vulcan merchandise, is on the diminutive side! Despite a footprint that's barely larger than Vulcan's feet, the museum store has long been popular with visitors and locals alike as the go-to place for unique gift and souvenir items. By next spring, the shop is expected to nearly triple in size, thanks to a planned construction project.

The remodeled shop will feature an expanded line of quality Birmingham- and Alabama- related items, as well as a broader selection of Vulcan memorabilia. Designed to reflect the decor of Vulcan Center, the shop's larger entrance, display windows and enhanced lighting will create a more inviting and pleasant shopping experience. "Demand has continued to increase for gifts to commemorate special events, items to add to collections, and keepsakes for out of town visitors" states director of operations Owen Blomeley. "This larger shop will allow us to significantly expand our inventory of locally produced, Alabama themed, and, of course, Vulcan branded items."

In addition to the shop expansion, the lobby Visitor Information desk will be remodeled to enhance interaction between visitors and the Greater Birmingham Convention and Visitors Bureau staff. New exhibitory is also expected to be installed in the

museum's Birmingham Today gallery as part of this project.

Repeat visitors may also notice the construction of a new ticket booth at the park's eastern pedestrian entrance. In keeping with the park's WPA look, the ticket booth will be clad in the same native sandstone as the 1930s observation tower. Specially designed lighting around the booth will serve the growing numbers of visitors who enjoy the spectacular views at night, without diminishing the drama of the existing lighting effects on the statue and tower.

In addition to these more obvious enhancements to the visitor experience, modifications to office and storage areas will be welcomed by staff. Scheduled during the slower winter months, construction is expected to begin on January 4, after the busy holiday and Birmingham Bowl season, to be completed in time for the busy spring season. Vulcan Park Foundation is grateful to the City of Birmingham, Mayor Bell and the members of the City Council, for taking on these much needed projects that promise to have a giant impact on all those influenced by our mission. These Vulcan Park and Museum projects are funded by bonds approved by taxpayers in 2012.
