Fiscal year 2024 was one for the books at Vulcan Park and Museum! We celebrated major milestones. including Vulcan's 120th birthday and the Foundation's 25th anniversary. New events like Vulcan's Spooktacular and Valentine with Vulcan attracted over 700 attendees. Our Vulcan at 120: Celebrating Birmingham's Iconic Iron Man exhibit drew an estimated 30,000 visitors, showcasing Vulcan's incredible journey and the community's dedication.

Overall, we welcomed over 61,000 visitors and hosted 183 events, with visitors from around the world. These record-breaking numbers underscore Vulcan's importance in Birmingham's cultural landscape.



This year, the Linn Henley Gallery featured a special exhibit celebrating Vulcan's 120th anniversary. Unveiled on February 22, 2024, the exhibit marked three major milestones: the 120th birthday of Vulcan, the 25th anniversary of Vulcan Park Foundation, and the 20th anniversary of the Park's reopening after extensive renovations.

Created in collaboration with the Kiwanis Club of Birmingham, the exhibit detailed Vulcan's journey from the 1904 World's Fair to its near loss in the 1990s and community-led restoration. Visitors enjoyed rarely seen images and stories.

The exhibit drew an estimated 30,000 visitors, offering a look into Vulcan's history and emphasizing the importance of preserving our cultural heritage. Through displays about Vulcan's construction, the community's rally to save him, and ongoing care and enhancements, the exhibit demonstrated how quality design and community effort have ensured Vulcan's lasting impact. The success of the exhibit underscores our commitment to celebrating and preserving Birmingham's rich history, inspiring current and future generations.
